LENT SEASON REFLECTIONS & PRAYER GUIDE 2025

Lent, the forty days in the Christian year that lead up to Easter, is a valuable time for Christians.

Lent is a period of prayer and spiritual rejuvenation anticipating a time when hope and fresh spiritual life are beginning to emerge. The Lenten season is an opportunity to grow in our spiritual lives through spiritual disciplines.

In the early church, new believers were baptized into its fellowship once a year on Easter. Before their baptism, they were given time to grow in their convictions. They would be baptized to symbolize their death to the power of evil and their call to be resurrected into a new life in Christ, who defeated the power of death on the first Easter. Over time, the entire devoted community began to regard this season as a time for growth in faithful discipleship. Lent emerged as a season when both new converts and the body of believers would become more closely associated with Jesus' living, dying, and rising. Thus, in today's Church, as in the early Church, Lent is intended to be experienced as a season for disciple-making. Lent is a season of rediscovery, a wonderful opportunity for us to engage ourselves more fully in the beauty and power of Jesus dying and rising to new life. It is a moment to reflect on the realities of death and resurrection and allow it to permeate our deepest selves.

Lent is a time of prayer when we are urged to take a break from the activity of our everyday busy lives and reconnect with the Spirit of God within. Prayer is essentially focused attention to God; it sets us in a listening position. Lent enables us to experience a new depth of prayer, a true devotion to God amid all the commotion and turbulence of our everyday lives, through which we learn to be strong in the Lord and the power of the Holy Spirit.

Fasting is a second practice linked with this season. Fasting represents a readiness to free ourselves from self-centred goals, aspirations, and pursuits. It denotes a readiness to be freed from the self-centeredness that drives so much of our lives to truly experience Christ's liberating power. Fasting teaches us that the most profound hunger in our life must be for God.

Almsgiving is the third practice linked with this season. It expresses an interior conversion concerning our neighbour while fasting expresses an interior conversion about us, and prayer expresses an interior conversion about God. Jesus holds up before us the image of the Good Samaritan, who stops to come to the aid of his neighbour, beaten and bloodied on the road. He not only pays for a room, but he takes care of the details. This required looking at a distressing image of humanity square in the face and acting in total selflessness.

This Year's Lent Season begins on 5th March (Ash Wednesday) and ends on 17th April 2025 (Maundy Thursday). We encourage you to take part in the 40 days of prayer and fasting between 6:00 am to 6:00 pm each day. We invite you to join an online prayer session every day from 5:00 am to 5:30 am by scanning the QR Code below.



On Wednesdays, The Church will remain open throughout the day and clergy will be available at the altar to pray for those who come during the day. In the evening, at 5:30 pm, we invite all congregants for a time of prayer during the Prayer and Healing Service.
